The duties of this position include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses; conducting research and other scholarly activities and performing departmental and university service and other duties assigned by the University. The normal teaching load is two courses per semester. Diversity and inclusion are core values of Washington University, and our aim is to create inclusive classrooms and environments in which a diverse array of students learn and thrive.

Qualifications

Candidates should demonstrate an ability to teach required core courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels in feminist theory or queer theory. Candidates must have completed their Ph.D. by June 30, 2025. Candidates for the rank of associate professor should have an outstanding academic record of research, publication, teaching, and service commensurate with tenure at that rank.
